His dad then runs to the garage gets a ladder to climb through the bathroom window and gets to Larry. Larry reflects on the peace that enters with his dad. His situation had not changed but he was no longer afraid as his father was with him.



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It is also important to note that God's peace while we wait is not meant for us to be comfortable but to be on mission. We must live by shining light on the path so that others are pointed to Jesus. It is with this peace that we can share the gospel unashamed and engage the lost. The joy I experienced while carolling in Rajasthan is a feeling I can relive now by sharing the good news with those around me.

In closing, our peace is wrapped in God's promises, in God's power and in God's purpose for us. Peace is not found in the absence of waiting, but in the presence of the one we are truly waiting with. His power is at work even in our waiting.
